Example includes Elephant ear plants; can also be excellent houseplants; plants are long leafed and require indirect light, avoid direct sunlight,

moist soil, avoid over watering; spider mites seen during high humidity; soil, course soil, sand and charcoal (to help retain moisture), fertilize monthly; repot easily, tubular sections used for propagation, best in the spring.

CONSERVATION REMINDER

November 12, 2020—This is just a reminder to all Garden Club members and friends:

Bill and I survived Tropical Storm Eta last night, thank goodness, without damage but some water over our seawall! However, I just spent several hours this morning cleaning thousands of Styrofoam pieces, plastic bottles and lids, plastic straws, and cigarette butts (to mention a few things!) out of the debris that washed up in our yard last night. I didn't get it all cleaned out by a long-shot before we pushed the foliage back into the canal, but I tried. That trash doesn't decompose—it pollutes!! Even the tiny pieces that are broken up may be ingested by the fish and wildlife, and then who eats it next.....

With so many who are taking advantage of "take out" food now, the use of Styrofoam is increasing rapidly. All of that toxic waste that winds up in our waterways is causing so much damage to our environment and in the long -term, may be making people sick! People may not think that a little bit of plastic or garbage won't make a difference, but it DOES!!

"ONE CLUB" INVESTIGATING COMMITTEE REPORT TO THE MEMBERS

The Garden Club of St. Petersburg is closing in on a possible milestone in the history of the Garden Club. Members are being asked to consider changing the status of the Club under the affiliation of F.F.G.C. from being a Club organized on the Circle plan, as it was formed in 1928, to an Independent Club.

With declining membership and loss of revenue accentuated by the pandemic, the Club has been facing challenging times. A small ad-hoc Committee was formed at the end of summer, adding more members at following meetings, including members of each Circle who are interested in possible changes, to investigate how the Club could operate as a unified Club. Questionnaires have been sent to the members and the Circle Presidents to get their thoughts about a reorganization, and there have been great comments in support of the concept!

Following is a proposed plan for the structure of the Club. The basic organization with an Executive Committee of elected officers, and a Board of Directors with representatives of various committees who are responsible for coordinating the functions of the Club, may be streamlined but remain much as it operates now. The most obvious change would be that the newly designated "Interest Groups" (made up of the present groups called "Circles") can be more flexible without elected officers and separated finances, but with more group and Club coordination and more opportunities to take advantage of all the programs and activities that the Club has to offer.

The goal of the Investigating Committee has been to create a plan for a unified organization, with members continuing to nurture the relationships that they have developed and to enjoy the learning and enriching experiences that they joined the Garden Club for, but all working together for the growth and success of the Garden Club of St. Petersburg. We will be stronger when we use the talents and gifts of ALL of our members!

A brief outline of the vision for the "Interest Groups" is listed below. You are invited to contact me or a Committee member for more information.

This proposal will be officially presented in January and all members will be asked to vote on (approve or disapprove) this renewed commitment to the future of the Garden Club of St. Petersburg, Inc., at a <u>Special Meeting that has been called for all members on Tuesday, February 9, 2021</u>. Mark your calendars—it's NOT in the Yearbook!

- A leader, or designated representative, of each group will be a member of the Board of Directors and attend the BOD meetings for dissemination of information.
- Decide on a meeting time in coordination with the Club's schedule.
- Set up programs in coordination with the Club's 1st Vice President and other groups for less duplication, with a focus on education.
- Group members have the option to visit other groups for selected programs.
- All finances are handled by the Club Treasurer—<u>groups do</u> <u>not have independent treasuries.</u> A budget of anticipated group expenses for the upcoming year is submitted to the Club Budget and Finance Committee to be included in the Club's proposed budget.
- Fundraising efforts, including participation and proceeds, to be combined with the entire Club--not competitive.
- All members are encouraged to participate in all Club activities, and to participate in the Committee system in any way they are able by signing up to help on a Committee, as well as participating in an Interest Group, if they choose.
- Members may elect not to be in an Interest Group and only participate in Club activities.
- More details will be determined as the plan is implemented and as the groups are organized.
